My family is both Ashkenazi (dad, hence the name) and Mizrachi (mom), and every year we do seder in a different household, alternating my Moroccan grandmother's house and my Ashkenazi grandparents' house. Growing up in those two completely different cultures, I thought a lot about my identity and how I fit in this big, complex mixture of cultures. For a long time I was carrying this feeling that I don't belong anywhere, and then it hit me - Israeli, that's my identity. Israel is this amazing melting pot of unique, special, phenomenal traditions and cultures, and we embrace and live all of them all at once. It was so clear to me - every year my Moroccan side of the family would celebrate Mimouna, this amazing celebration after Passover, and my Ashkenazi family would come and embrace it all - this is what Israel is all about. How didn't I see it before? I was so busy looking at the differences instead of seeing what brings us together. This year I'll get to do seder without my family, creating a new tradition, somewhat familiar, but also somewhat different; in my new home away from home.

What happens when you take a fancy ceremonial classical band and leave them stranded in a desert town in the middle on nowhere, Israel? Well, to find out, you'll have to watch the critically acclaimed movie - "The Band's Visit" - a film masterpiece that was turned into a massive hit musical on Broadway. The Band's Visit received critical acclaim, winning eight awards from the Israeli Film Academy and prizes at several international film festivals. The director, Eran Kolirin, in his cinema directorial debut, won the Israeli Film Academy awards for Best Director and Best Screenplay.



The movie tells the fictional story of the Alexandria Ceremonial Police Orchestra that arrives in Israel from Egypt. The band was booked to perform in Petach Tikvah in Israel. However, because of miscommunication they arrive in the Negev Desert, to a small, underdeveloped fictional town called Beit Tikvah. What seems at first like the worst thing that could happen to them, is revealed as a great opportunity to dig deep into their repressed feelings, desires and longings. You're probably thinking why on Earth I am recommending a movie set in the middle of the desert in a spring newsletter? The answer is really simple; this movie talks about rejuvenating, about new beginnings – and this is what spring and Passover is all about. Furthermore, Ben–Gurion's dream was to make the desert bloom, and this movie shows perfectly how much you can get from the amazing Negev Desert...

The Spark IL Initiative for Small Businesses





This incredible Israeli Initiative helps aspiring small businesses to bloom in a unique, special platform. The famous Talmudic passage הזה לזה לזה לוה (kol Yisrael areivim ze laze) teaches that all Jewish people are responsible one for another. Despite our knack for disagreement, this value remains a cornerstone of Jewish Peoplehood. According to the Rambam, there are eight levels of charitable giving. The highest form is when a donor or lender empowers the recipient to become self-supporting. This is generally defined as giving someone a business loan or helping someone to find a job. This is exactly what Spark IL does.

Spark IL chooses business opportunities that are good for society and allows you to invest in them. Spark IL prefer using the word "invest" and not "loan" because once you invest in a business, you are fully aware of the development of the business. When the Borrower's goal is met, the full loan is released. If the Borrower doesn't meet his/her/their full funding goal, you can allocate your funds to a different business or have them returned. The borrower eventually repays the loan and advances their social impact goals. After that, you can re-invest your money. I think that's it's a great opportunity to build bridges and create meaningful connections to Israel and to the people living in it (not all Jewish!). That's the power of Spark IL. I invite you to check Spark IL out and make a difference, it really goes a long way!

Here at Temple Emanuel we're also very lucky to be a part of a Spark IL B' Mitzvah program, through a generous donation from a board member of JAFI. We give our B' Mitzvah students vouchers to invest in Israeli business opportunities through Spark IL, and, hopefully create a meaningful connection to the holy land while going through the B-Mitzvah process. We are very lucky to be a part of this program and with our B' Mitzvah students getting a \$3,250 Israel Trip from NFTY it seems like a perfect match, and maybe our students will even get to see the business they invested in come alive!



Time for Food! Seder Dessert Recipe - Kosher for Passover Choco-nut Cake!

In my opinion - this is the ultimate Passover dessert. This three layered cake, with a cloud-like coconut base, chocolate mousse and cream top is a gluten free dessert you don't want to pass on (get it? Passover...). This cake started as a big controversy in my house. A famous celebrity pastry chef in Israel made it on her cooking show, and it was a hit all over Israel. Of course, my mom and grandmother didn't skip on the trend and made it too, to the dislike of my brother - who hates coconut. One taste was enough to make him forget that he hates the tropical delicacy, and from a Passover dessert this cake became a Shabbat dinner fundamental. This cake looks complicated, but it's really straightforward, uses few ingredients and super easy. It does require some time to set - but it is guaranteed to wow all of your guests!


Directions

Making the First Layer:

- With a standing mixer (or A LOT of elbow grease), whip the eggs white while adding the sugar gradually. The mixture is supposed to somewhat resemble shaving cream.
- Add the coconut to the mixture and fold it in carefully, trying to deflate as little air as possible.
- Transfer to a springform pan and bake in an oven preheated to 350°F for 30 minutes until golden and firm to the touch.
 Let it cool completely before moving to the next step.

Making the Other Layers and Assembling:

- Melt the chocolate and butter in a microwave safe bowl.
- Add in the egg yolks and pop in the microwave again for 10-15 seconds, making sure to mix rapidly later, to avoid curdling the eggs. This will make sure you don't consume raw eggs. Let it cool.
- While cooling, with a standing mixer (or A LOT of elbow grease), whip the heavy cream, pudding mix and sugar until soft peaks form.
- Take half of the cream mixture and incorporate it to the chocolate mixer. When combined, spread over the cooled coconut layer and put in the fridge for an hour to set.
- Once the chocolate layer sets, spread the remaining of the cream mixture on top and pop in the fridge again until completely set and preferably overnight.
- Serve and enjoy! If you make it, send me a pic! בתיאבון



Ingredients

For the Coconut Layer:

- 6 egg whites
- 1 cup of white sugar
- 2 cups (200g) of shredded coconut

For the Chocolate Layer:

- · 7 oz of bittersweet chocolate
- 3½ tablespoons of butter
- 6 egg yolks

For the Cream Layer:

- 2½ cups of heavy whipping cream
- 1/4 cup of white sugar
- 2 tablespoons of vanilla pudding mix


