Pride 2023 Celebrations in Israel!

Every June, the streets of Israel get a colorful facelift. It's the season when Israelis celebrate Pride! The Annual Israeli Pride Parade takes place in Tel-Aviv. This year over 100,000 people took a part in this amazing event demonstrating their solidarity and support for the LGBTQA+ community. Earlier in the month, the Jerusalem Pride and Tolerance March, took place and a wave of supporters joined this amazing cause and celebrated pride in the Capital of Israel.

It's important to point out that the celebrations of pride don't stop here – Israel celebrates pride all month long (and actually all year long...) with special shows, concerts, parties and so much more held all over the country – giving people the opportunity to be themselves and celebrate with pride!

Time for Food! Summer Dessert -Israeli Icebox Cake Recipe!

If you ask me - this is the taste of Israeli summer. You can go to the market and get a cold freshly-squeezed pomegranate juice (and you should do that), or stop at the local ice-cream store (preferably "Golda") and get a scoop or two, but this cake is unbeatable. This is the taste of home in the summer. I remember begging my grandmother to make this for me every weekend, walking down the street to the supermarket with her and getting the ingredients to make this incredibly easy recipe. We call it also a biscuit cake, because it's made from layers of delicious pudding and Israeli biscuits. I really recommend going the extra mile and going to your nearby Israeli/Kosher-Mart to get the Israeli brand products because it does, in fact, make a difference (and tastes like you're on the shore in Tel-Aviv...). This recipe will definitely take your summer game a few levels up, Bon Appetit!

Directions

Making the Custard:

- in a bowl, mix the heavy cream, milk, sugar and pudding mix and whisk them until soft peaks form.
- To that mixture add the cream cheese and whisk again to achieve stiff peaks; the mixture should be able to hold its shape.
- In a pan, start lining biscuits dipped in milk/coffee. Top them with half the pudding mixture, and then alternate layers with biscuits and pudding mixture. You can assemble any number of layers you desire.
- Garnish with chocolate shavings/coffee/cocoa/chocolate ganache or anything you want!
- Cover up and put in the freezer for 4 hours at least, preferably overnight. Cut and enjoy! בתיאבון

Ingredients

- ³/₄ cup of milk
- 1 cup of heavy cream
- <u>1 pack of vanilla pudding mix</u> (<u>Preferably Osem brand</u>)
- 5 tablespoons of sugar
- 8 oz of cream cheese (you can also use light cream cheese)
- 1 cup of milk or coffee (for dipping the biscuits)
- <u>2 packs of Osem Tea Biscuits</u>
- Chocolate bar for decorating
