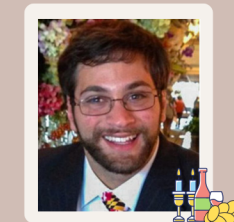
DISCUSSION GROUP, FEB 11 @ 9:30AM
