Dreaming of Freedom

Passover, in Hebrew, has many names. Chag Ha'Aviv, for example, means The Holiday of Spring, as during Passover nature rejuvenates and starts to blossom. Another one is Chag Ha'Matzot, referencing, of course, the Matzot that the Israelites ate when fleeing Egypt and the ones we eat during the holiday to this day. The one I'm struggling with right now is Chag Ha'Cherut, which means the Holiday of Freedom. How can we celebrate freedom when 133 hostages are still being kept in horror tunnels underneath Gaza? How can we talk about ideas of Cherut when a terror organization is continuously oppressing everyone in the region, including their own people?

My fellow Shaliach and good friend, Abraham and I went on a trip to the Midwest a few weeks ago. We debated a lot whether or not we should cancel our plans completely. The thought of going on the trip with everything that is going on in Israel was hard to balance. We came to the conclusion that we should go, as it would be a good opportunity to gain strength and think about what is to come. On our trip, we visited a lot of landmarks and, in a fitting way, a word that continued to pop up was "Freedom". Here in the US, people dreamed of freedom, and fought to achieve it. We thought a lot about the Jewish fight and struggle, and our friends in the front lines and in terror chambers, fighting for their freedom, for the freedom to be a עָם חוֹפָשִי בָּאַרְצֵנוּ, free people in our homeland. Abraham made Aliyah to Israel with his family when he was six because his parents dreamed of being free, of a better future to their kids. I'm thinking a lot about if this promise is fulfilled - if not for Abraham, then for the kids of Kibbutz Nir Oz or, Be'eri or K'far Aza. As we gazed at the Mount Rushmore National Monument we thought about freedom, about Passover, we stood there and stared at the four founding fathers, looking and praying for better days, of Freedom, of Cherut, for everyone. This holiday we'll pray for a better future and the end of the suffering everywhere.

Movies are a great tool to take us back in time and to different places. This movie takes its source material - the novel of the same name by A. B. Yehoshua, and gives it life in a captivating film set in Israel of 2002, during the second Intifada. This movie is critically acclaimed, with a star studded cast of Gila Almagor and Gori Alfi, and winning 5 Ophir Awards (Israeli Oscars), including Best Picture, Best Screenplay and Best Director for Eran Riklis.



The movie follows begins with the tragic death of Yulia, an immigrant to Israel that worked in a bakery in Jerusalem. When a paycheck leads an investigator to the bakery, and blames them for negligant handling of her death arrangements, it's up to the Human Resources Manager to travel to Eastern Europe, and make sure Yulia will get honored in and buried in her village.

Bring Them Home Haggadah - New Initiative from the Missing and Hostages Families Forum

As I mentioned before, Passover is a holiday of Cherut, of freedom, but how can we commemorate freedom, when 133 innocent lives are being held in the depth of hell in tunnels under Gaza? the Missing and Hostages Families Forum was created after the horrible events of October 7th, and trying to raise awareness ever since to the hostage situation and to call for international attention to the problem and the immediate release of all hostages.

In their latest campaign, the Missing and Hostages Families Forum came together with a special version of the traditional Haggadah we know. This Haggadah is produced by Be'eri Print in Kibbutz Be'eri. On October 7th, more than 90 of its residents were murdered and over 20 were kidnapped to Gaza. The Haggadah is also embedded with messages of hope and inspiration by Israeli spiritual and cultural leaders: Rabbi Yisrael Lau, Miriam Peretz, Chaim Yellin, and Rita. This Passover is different from all others in our lifetimes. The idea of leaving slavery for freedom takes on a new meaning and today we are full of hope that we will emerge from the journey with a strong hand and an outstretched arm ("Be'yad Hazaka U'vezroa Netuya").

Israeli Recipe - Matzo Cake

Don't knock it till you try it! During Passover, you have to be creative. A lot of people are afraid of using the Matzot for baking, and I thought like this too until my friend told me to taste this cake. I never thought something this good (and simple!) would come out of matzot - but I was wrong! This great, chocolaty cake is a great dessert option, and you may even want to start eat it even when it's not Passover...

<u>Ingridients</u>

For Chocolate Layer:

- 8 oz (2 bars) Dark Chocolate
- ½ Cup of Milk
- ½ Cup of Sugar
- 2 Tablespoons Cocoa Powder
- 1Stick of Butter
- 2 Tablespoons Nutella (or any other Chocolate spread)

For Matvo Layer:

- 1Cup of Water
- 1 Teaspoon Instant Coffee
- 1 Pack of Matzot
- Shredded Coconut, for decoration

Directions

- Start with making the Chocolate Layer: Put dark chocolate, milk, sugar and cocoa in a small pot.
- Heat up on low heat until everything is melted and combined.
- Take off the heat and add the butter and chocolate spread and mix until melted. Set aside to cool.
- Mix the instant coffee with water and dip the Matzo for 30 seconds on each side.
- Put a wet matzo on the bottom of your pan and layer with chocolate cream. repeat about 5 times (or until your pan is full)
- · Decorate with coconut if desired.
- Chill in the fridge for at least 4 hours (preferably overnight)
