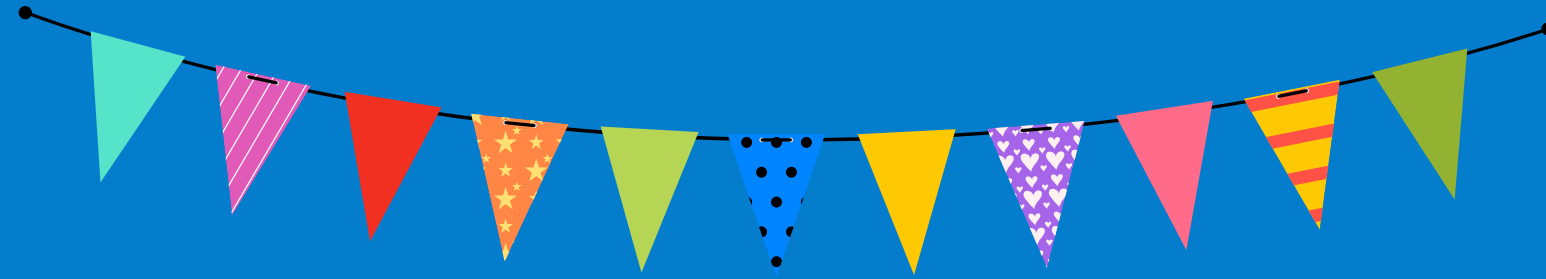

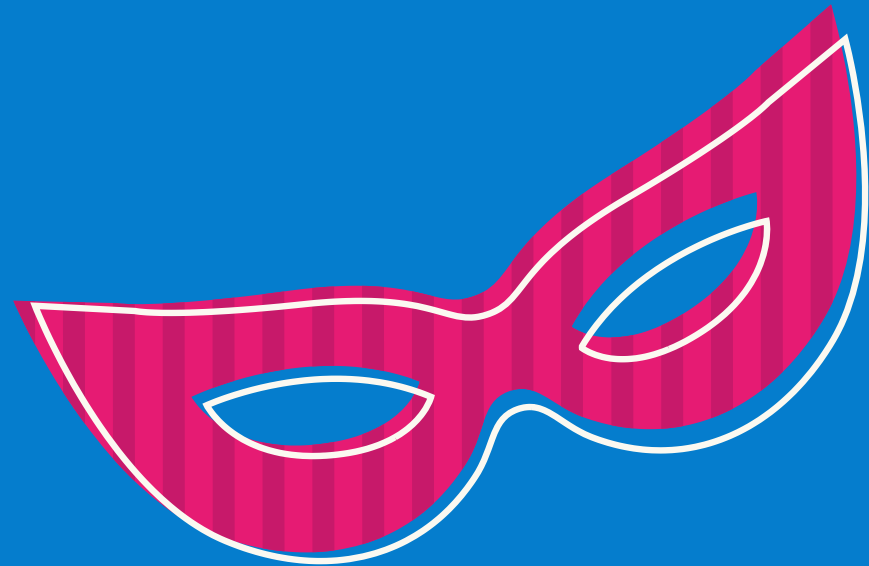
Purim is...

told in the Book of Esther.**

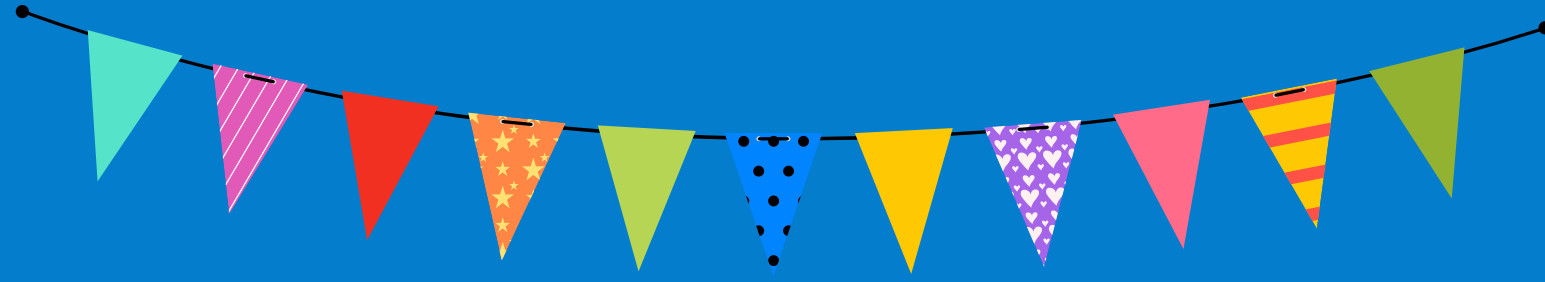


We can dress up in costumes or wear regular clothes.

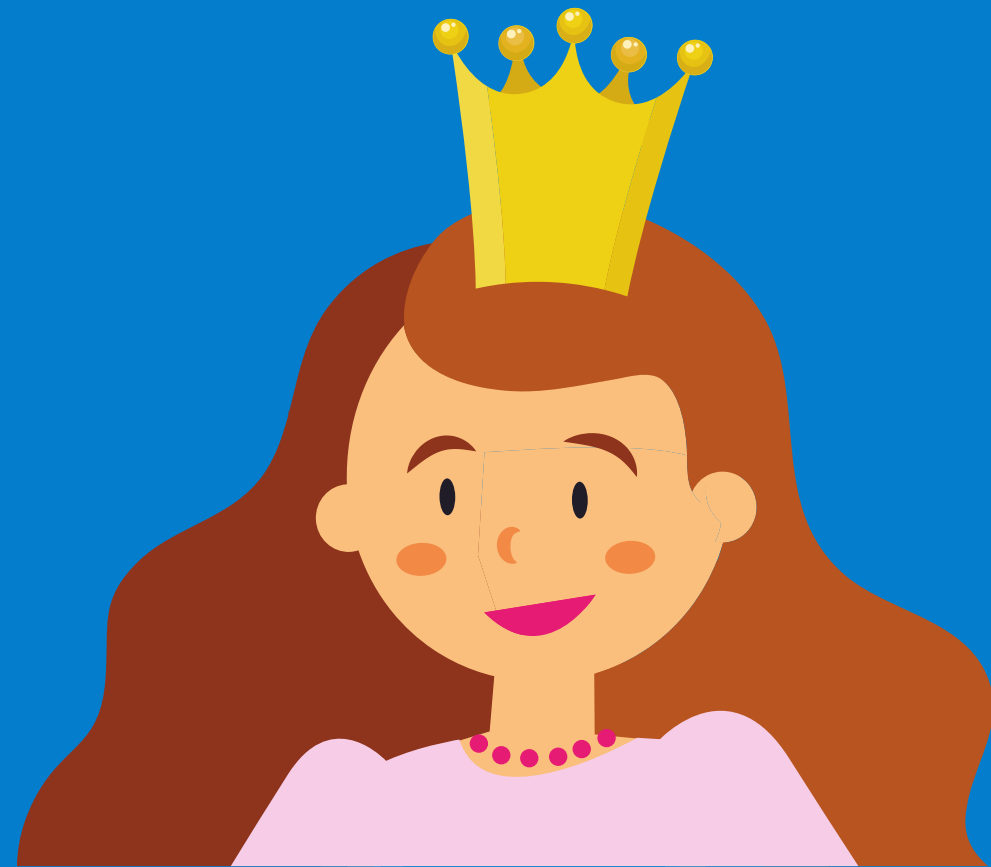




**My teachers, the Rabbi, and Cantor
might also be wearing costumes.**

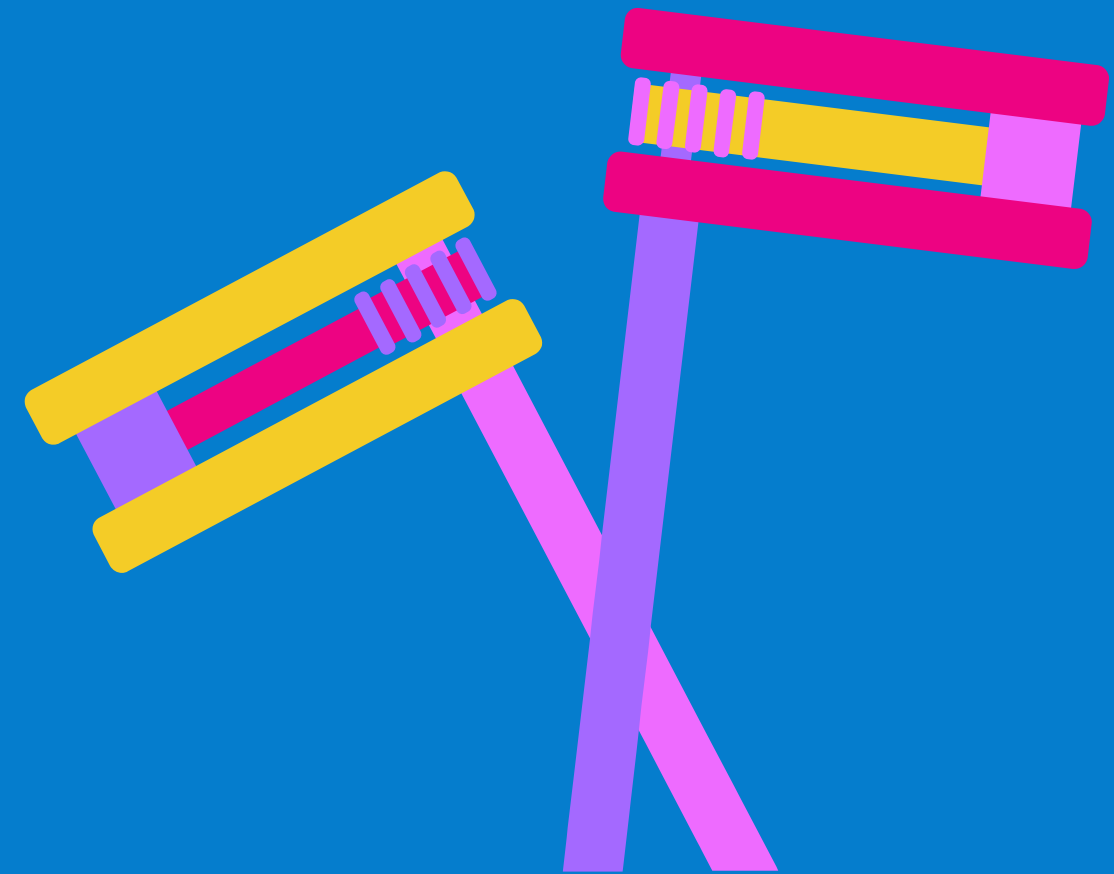


We will retell the story of Esther.

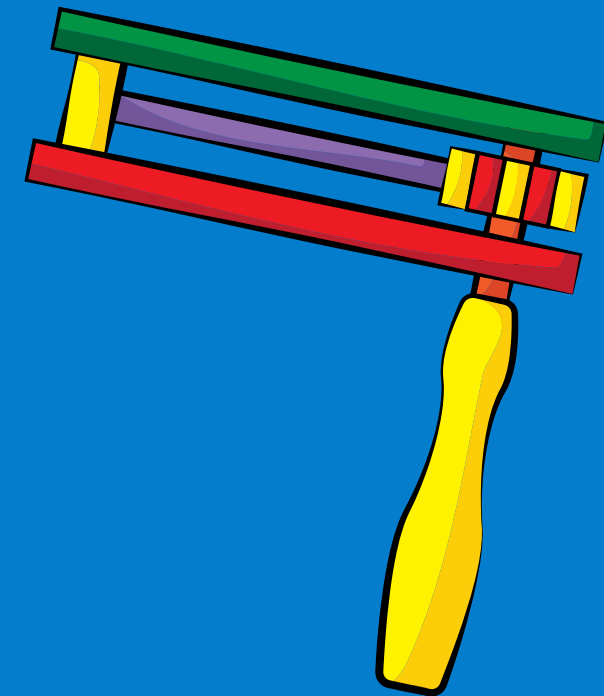
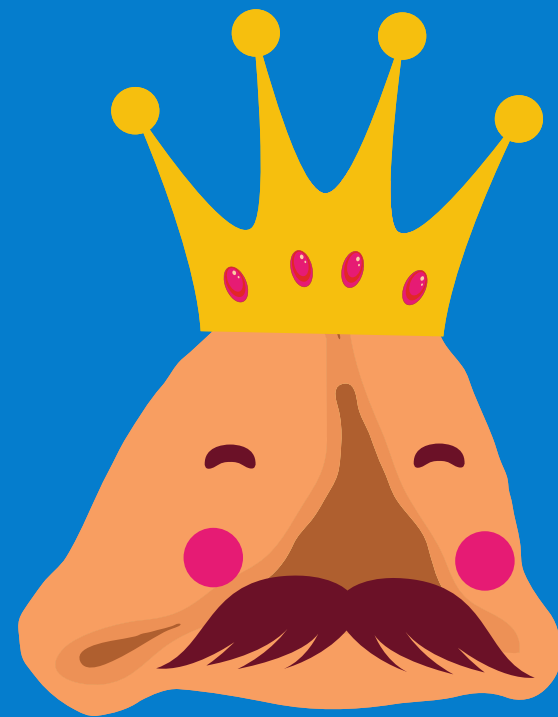


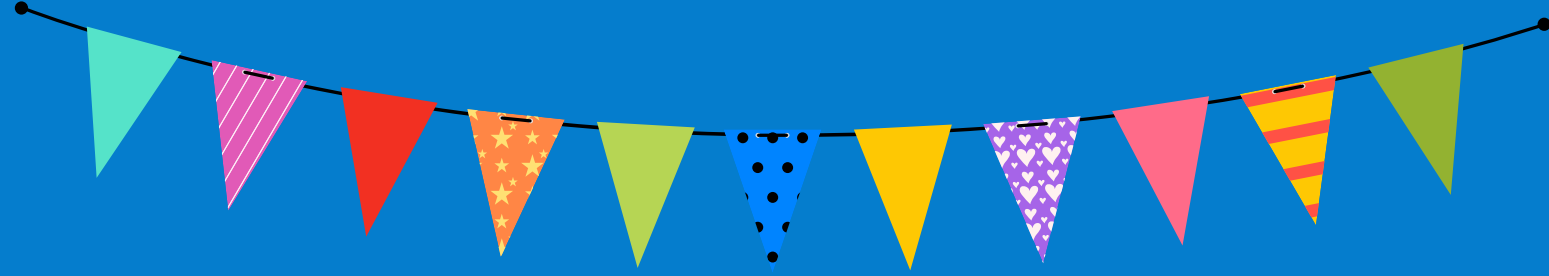


**There will be noise

groggers.**



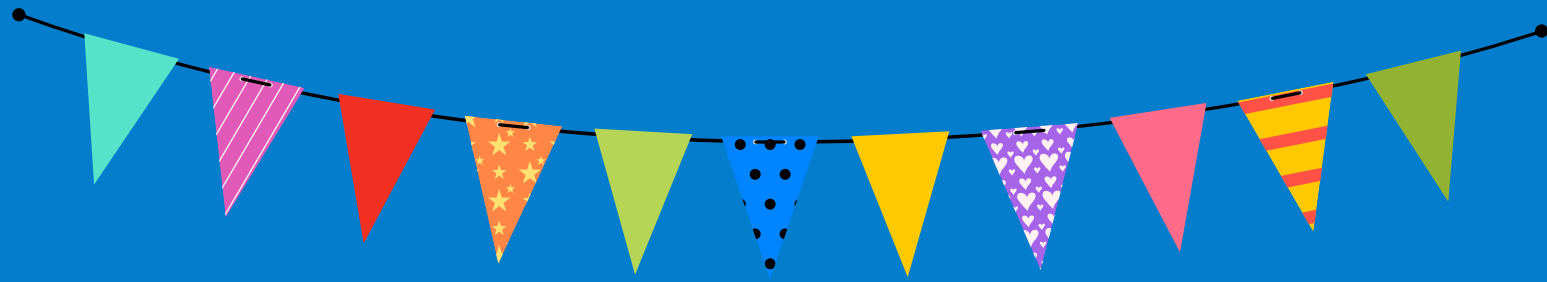
We will say “boo” and shake our groggers when we hear the name Hamen because he is a “bad guy.” This might sound loud.



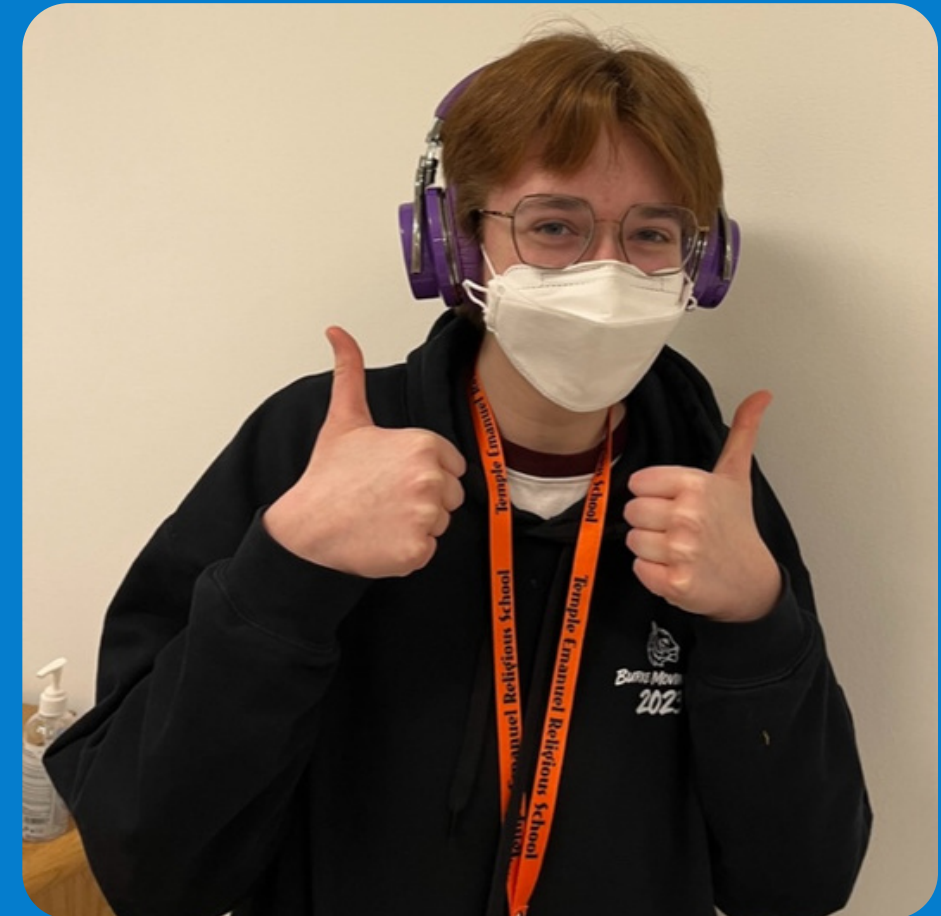



There might be loud music.

loud for me.



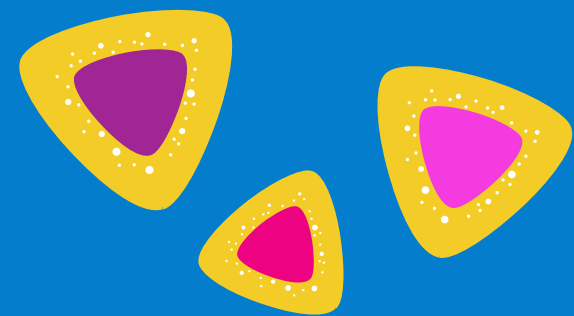


**I can take a break in

adult.**

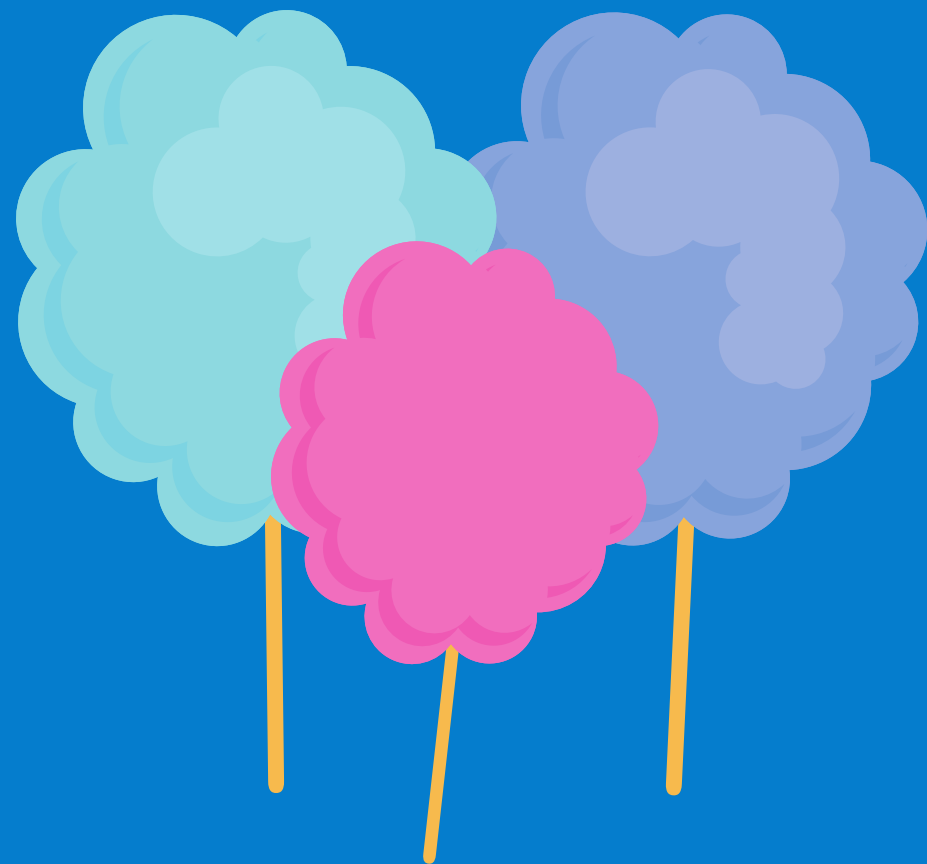

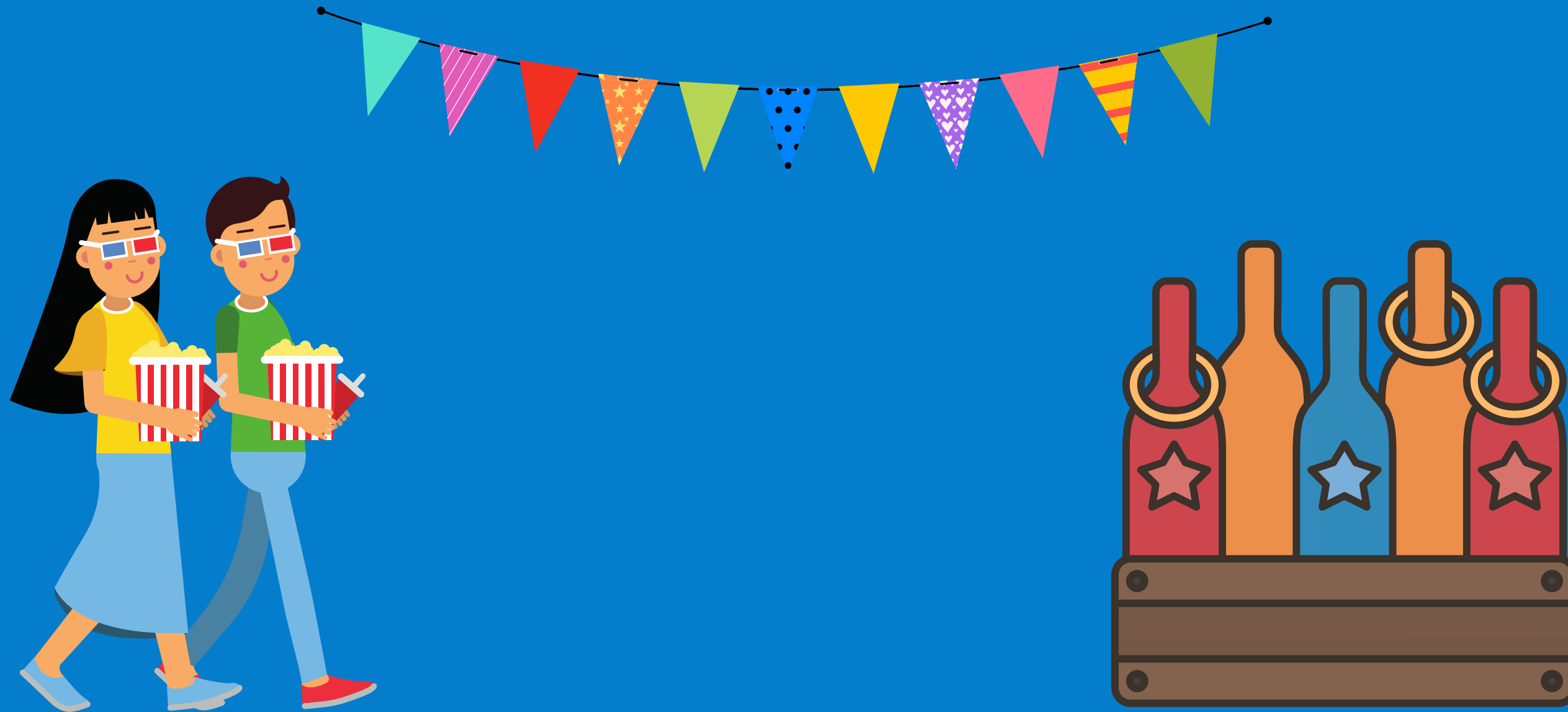
**I will need a wristband for
the food and games.**

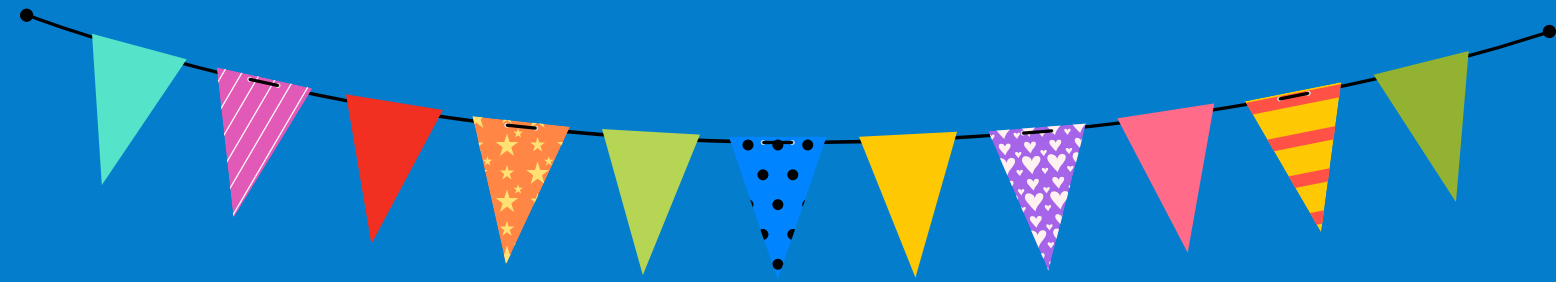


There will be food such as popcorn, cotton candy, hot dogs, drinks, and hamantashen.

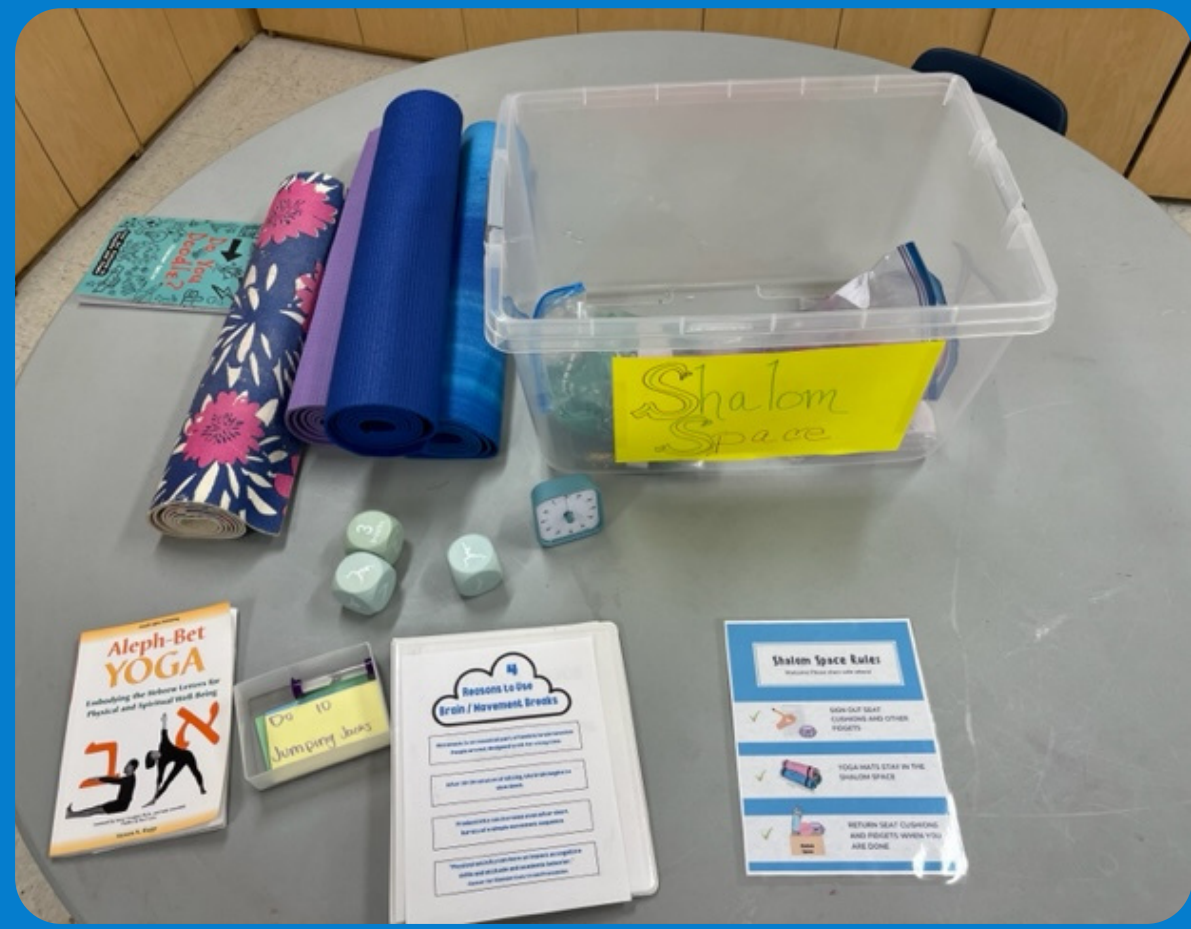


There will be games and prizes.

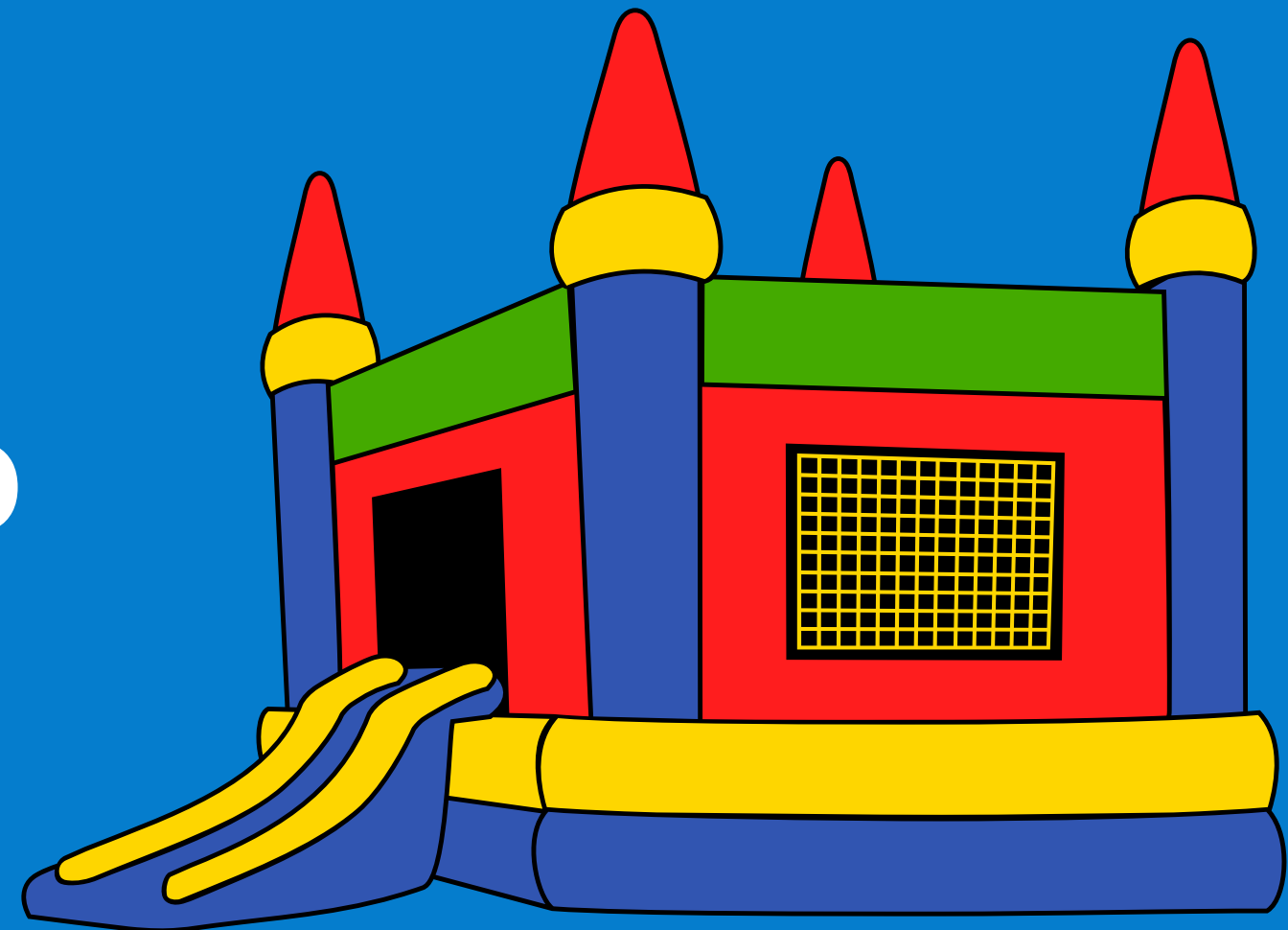




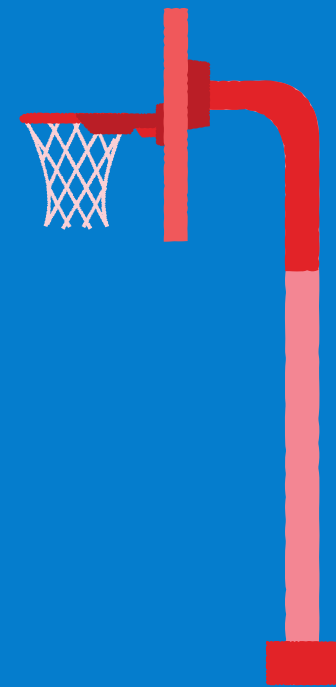
I can ask my teachers or parent to go to the Shalom Space if I need a quiet space or a break.
