

## Yuval Raphael Represents Israel in the 2025 Eurovision

Yuval Raphael, a 24-year-old singer from Ra'anana, Israel, captivated audiences worldwide with her poignant ballad "New Day Will Rise" at the Eurovision Song Contest 2025. A survivor of the October 7, 2023, Hamas attack at the Nova music festival, Raphael endured eight harrowing hours hiding under bodies in a bomb shelter, sustaining shrapnel injuries. Her resilience and passion for music propelled her to victory in Israel's "HaKokhav HaBa" (Israeli American Idol) competition, earning her the opportunity to perform on the biggest international stage.

In Basel, Switzerland, Raphael delivered a stirring performance of "New Day Will Rise," a song that resonated deeply with audiences across Europe. The ballad, written by Keren Peles and produced by Tomer Biran, features lyrics in English, French, and Hebrew, symbolizing unity and hope amidst adversity. Her emotive delivery and the song's powerful message earned her 357 points, getting her to the incredible **second place** in the competition.

Raphael's journey from tragedy to the Eurovision stage has garnered widespread support, with many viewing her as a symbol of perseverance and the healing power of music. Despite facing protests and political tensions surrounding Israel's participation in the contest, she remained focused on delivering a performance that transcended politics, emphasizing love and hope. Israel also received the highest number of audience votes at this year's Eurovision, reflecting a powerful wave of public support for the young nation during a particularly challenging time on the global stage.

Her success at Eurovision 2025 not only highlights her personal triumph but also serves as a testament to the unifying power of music during challenging times. As Yuval concluded her performance in the Eurovision finale: "Thank you Europe! Am Yisrael Chai!"

### Israeli Movie Recommendation <u>The Goal - שושנה חלוץ מרכזי</u>

Way before Wonder Woman, Snow White or Red Note, our Israeli superstar was making her first steps in the Israeli film industry. In 2014, Gadot scored her first role in an Israeli feature length film, Shay Kanot's *The Goal* (also known as Kicking Out Shoshana), an Ilsraeli sports comedy that managed to surprise me. The film tells the story of a talented footballer who is forced to lie about his sexuality after getting into trouble with mobsters. It features an ensemble cast with some of Israel's biggest comedians, including Eli Finish and Mariano Edelman.

The film was a box office success and sold about 62,000 tickets within ten days of its release – which is a lot for Israel! Many critics praised the performance of the main actors, and of the once-newcomer actress, Gal Gadot, but criticized the way the film presents characters from the LGBTQ+ community, even though the filmmakers claim that the film was written to "embrace" the community. 
#### Temple Emanuel at the JxJ Festival


#### On The Horizon


This wasn't just a ceremony — it was a homecoming. And I'm deeply grateful to call you all part of my Jewish journey.
