Last month, on May 21st, I sent out my monthly newsletter. Per usual, I discussed ideas of community, family, and belonging. I had just celebrated my (second) Bar Mitzvah and was filled with a sense of pride in myself and my Jewish identity and I shared that with all of you.

My good friend Abraham and I went south on a trip to Texas (and the neighboring states), and that evening (May 21st) while enjoying country music and sipping on beer, our phones started chiming like crazy. "Are you okay?", "I heard something has happened in D.C.", "Please answer so I know you're safe". Those were some of the messages we got.



We immediately checked the news and monitored the updates in real time – a terror attack in D.C., right next to the Capital Jewish Museum. I was getting flashbacks, not the good kind. It was almost like October 7th, but the other way around. Back then, I was on the other side of the texting chain. Now it's the other way around.

My sense of pride slowly disintegrated. I was scared. For the rest of the evening, Abe and I talked English with each other, scared to use our native tongue. In the following morning, fear turned into anger. Watching the news and learning about the deaths of Yaron and Sarah, two beautiful souls, advocating for peace, unity and a better future for everyone, made me feel angry and frustrated. The terrorist aimed at the Jewish community. It's not about Israel; it's about our Jewish identity.

Suddenly, it was clear to me – that's what our enemy wants. They want us to be afraid. They want us to be ashamed of who we are; they want us to hide it. Well, I decided I'm not going to let them win that battle. As antisemitism rises, and we witness horrible acts of terror against Jews everywhere across North America and the world, it's time to remember who we are, what we stand for, and be proud of our identities.

As we're amidst Pride Month, in which we celebrate identities and this very idea of a sense of who we are, I encourage everyone to be true to themselves, to what they believe in, and to be proud.

Following the attack, my good friend Noa, a Shlicha in Florida, shared the graphic on the right with me. The graphic shows the connection we have, the US and Israel, and how events happening here affect lives in Israel, and vice versa. Together we're stronger, together we're better, together no one can defeat us.

Israel News Operation Rising Lion

Over the past week, Israel launched Operation Rising Lion, a strategic military response targeting Iranian nuclear and terror infrastructure. The operation was initiated after mounting evidence that Iran was rapidly advancing its nuclear capabilities and continuing to fund and arm terror groups across the region. Israel's strikes were precise and focused exclusively on military and nuclear sites — a clear attempt to prevent a genocidal regime from obtaining weapons of mass destruction, and using them against Israel and the West, as they clearly stated before.

With precision airstrikes on Natanz, Isfahan, Tehran's Defense Ministry, and missile bases — coordinated in part with covert drone support inside Iran — Israel delivered a powerful blow aimed squarely at preventing a nuclear-armed terror attack. In retaliation, Iran's response could not have been more stark: a barrage of over 150 ballistic missiles and 100+ drones fired at Israeli cities, including Tel Aviv, Bat Yam, Rishon LeZion, Ramat Gan Haifa, Jerusalem and much more — specifically aiming deep into civilian areas. The attack killed innocent people, including children and elderly, and injured many more. This latest escalation highlights a critical truth: Israel is doing what much of the world cannot or will not — standing up to a regime that thrives on terror and fear. In defending its people, Israel is also defending the values of life, democracy, and freedom in a region where those ideals are constantly under threat. As we monitor the situation closely, we pray for the operation to end swiftly, the end of this horrible war, and most importantly, the return of the remaining 53 hostages back home to their families and loved ones.






Israeli Movie Recommendation

Israeli Recipe - Omer Neutra's Peanut Butter Cookies

As we marked the holiday of Shavuot, we also marked the end of the Omer, the period of time between Passover and Shavuot. I couldn't help but thinking about Omer Neutra. For the longest time his family didn't know anything about his condition following the events of October 7th. After 422, they received the information that he was killed on that horrible day and his body is being held by the Hamas terrorists. Omer was a ray of sunshine, an Israeli-American that made Aliyah from New Jersey to serve in the IDF. This recipe of simple PB cookies radiates what Omer was - a simple man. As we count the days of the Omer, his family counts the days until they can bury him respectfully. Our count is over, but theirs is not. I pray for the return of all 53 remaining hostages quickly - the living to rehabilitation and the dead to burial.



INGREDIENTS:

- 1 CUP PEANUT BUTTER
- 1 CUP DARK BROWN SUGAR
- 1 EGG (M SIZE)
- 1 TEASPOON BAKING SODA
- 100G CHOCOLATE CHIPS OR CHOPPED CHOCOLATE

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. MIX ALL THE INGREDIENTS IN A BOWL UNTIL WELL COMBINED.
- 2. SCOOP THE DOUGH INTO BALLS USING AN ICE CREAM SCOOP.
- 3. PLACE THE COOKIE BALLS ON A BAKING SHEET AND BAKE FOR 8-10 MINUTES AT 180°C (350°F), OR UNTIL THEY'RE GOLDEN BROWN.
